MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 10th November 2016 had been circulated.

MATTERS ARISING

- a) We do not need a carbon monoxide monitor in the kitchen;
- b) The fee for the green waste bin has been paid.
- c) The defibrillator has been installed at the side of the Hall. The Parish Council is in charge of operation and management.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Cash in hand (Lloyds Bank): £25,652.28p.

Market Harborough Building Society: £10,202.37p.

Helen pointed out that the figures include a £10,000 grant from the Lottery Fund which we have obtained to rebuild the entrance to the Hall.

They include the income of £1,200 for the 100 Club income, but not payments to the winners for January, February and March.

HALL BOOKINGS.

The Hall continues to be well used. Now that the Great Glen Crematorium is open, Arthur and Norma will look into the possibility of publishing Village Hall hire fees with the management and with local funeral directors.

HALL MAINTENANCE

a) Nick has repaired the leak in the Gents' toilet - the problem is caused by initial poor installation of the overflow system, which he will sort out.

- b) Windows in the Brian Pollard room now need to be replaced. Arthur and Nick will obtain quotes and report to the next meeting;
- c) An electrics inspection has revealed that the hostess trolley in the kitchen has to be condemned.
- d) The radiators in the main hall have been bled; the heating clock and thermostat have been adjusted. Sally reported that the people in the Yoga Class are now happy with the temperature.
- e) Nick and Arthur will investigate cost of installing some kitchen shelving to be used for Christmas Tree Festival catering.
- f) Essential refurbishment of the hall floor will be covered by the Lottery Grant;
- g) Discussion re replacement/cleaning of the awning in the main hall: Sally to find out prices for a new awning. Redecoration of the hall, fixing of the fans and replacement lighting will be included in any work on the awning.

Hall Entrance: Planning permission for removal of the tree to the left of the door has been obtained.

The aim of alterations to the entrance is to make the area more user-friendly, more suitable for disabled access, including extra disabled parking. The replacement steps will be broader and shallower; paving will be safer and less slippery. Nick and Arthur are investigating alternative pavings and will obtain quotes for the work, which is estimated to take 2-3 weeks, and is likely to begin mid-late August.
